THE CHRISTIAN & MISSIONARY ALLIANCE

A.B. Simpson was a New York pastor from Canada who had a heart for the nations. Throughout the 1880s, he planted his own church (New York Gospel Tabernacle), wrote his own missionary magazine (known today as Alliance Life), and started the first Bible institute (known today as Nyack College). His church opened new branches in several cities across the country and sent out more and more missionaries across the world. Simpson's ministry became "The Christian and Missionary Alliance" in 1897, but it wasn't until the 1960s that the C&MA became an official denomination.

The Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) is the mission and heart of the C&MA. It is our primary call: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

We believe that the local church is God's instrument for bringing the message of Jesus to the whole earth. Because of that, we work to establish communities of Christ throughout the world that will multiply themselves, resulting in self-sustaining, evangelical churches within the reach of all people.

JESUS CHRIST IS OUR SAVIOR

The Name of Jesus has impacted lives around the world for more than 2,000 years. He is a universal Savior, promising that: "whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Jesus is an exclusive Savior. "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name in heaven given to men by which we must be saved" Acts 4:12. Contrary to what contemporary culture tells us, there are not multiple paths to God. There is only one—Jesus Christ.



JESUS CHRIST IS OUR SANCTIFIER.

Many Christians understand God's promise of salvation but do not experience the ongoing sanctifying work of Jesus Christ in their lives. For those who neither understand nor allow the Holy Spirit's control in their lives, the results have a profound effect.

Unsuccessful struggle against sin and a lack of power in life and ministry frustrate those who have asked Jesus to be their Savior but not their Sanctifier, resulting in a lack of joy in their walk with Christ. "It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption." 1 Corinthians 1:30



JESUS CHRIST IS OUR HEALER.

A great portion of Christ's time was dedicated to healing the sick. He healed all kinds of people: the blind, the paralyzed, the lame, the deaf, lepers, those who had fevers, and many with chronic illnesses.

We find no record in the gospels of Jesus turning away anyone who came to him for healing, nor do we find that any disease was too difficult for him to heal. He even raised the dead. Miraculous healings still occur today—evidence that Christ is still our Healer. "And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven." James 5:15



JESUS CHRIST IS OUR COMING KING.

The physical return of Jesus has been the subject of speculation and controversy since His ascension into the clouds, which is recorded in the New Testament Book of Acts. Knowing that countless millions still have not heard the gospel, The Alliance is committed to doing its part to complete Christ's Great Commission before His imminent return. "This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." Acts 1:11

THE ALLIANCE STATEMENT OF FAITH

We believe that certain truths are indispensable for genuine Christian life and witness. Among these truths are:

- 1. There is one God, who is infinitely perfect, existing eternally in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Deut. 6:4; Matthew 5:48; Matthew 28:19)
- 2. **Jesus Christ is true God and true man.** He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He died upon the cross, the Just for the unjust, as a substitutionary sacrifice, and all who believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood. He arose from the dead according to the Scriptures. He is now at the right hand of His Majesty on high as our great High Priest. He will come again to establish His Kingdom of righteousness and peace. (Phil. 2:6-11; Luke 1:36-38; I Peter 3:18; Hebrews 2:9; Romans 5:9; Acts 2:23,24; Hebrews 8:1; Matthew 26:64)
- 3. The Holy Spirit is a divine Person come to indwell, guide, teach, empower the believer, and convince the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. (John 14:15-18; John 16:13; Acts 1:8; John 16:7-11)
- 4. The Old and New Testaments, inerrant as originally given, were verbally inspired by God and are a complete revelation of His will for the salvation of men. They constitute the divine and only rule of Christian faith and practice. (2 Peter 1:20,21; 2 Timothy 3:15,16)
- 5. Man was originally created in the image and likeness of God; he fell through disobedience, incurring, thereby, physical and spiritual death. All men are born with a sinful nature, are separated from the life of God, and can be saved only through the atoning work of the Lord Jesus Christ. The portion of the impenitent and unbelieving is existence forever in conscious torment; and that of the believer, in everlasting joy and bliss. (Genesis 1:27; Romans 3:23; I Corinthians 15:20-23; Revelation 21:8; Revelation 21:1-4)
- 6. Salvation has been provided through Jesus Christ for all men; and those who repent and believe in Him are born again of the Holy Spirit, receive the gift of eternal life, and become the children of God. (Titus 3:4-7)
- 7. It is the will of God that each believer should be filled with the Holy Spirit and be sanctified wholly, being separated from sin and the world and fully dedicated to the will of God, thereby receiving power for holy living and effective service. This is both a crisis and a progressive experience wrought in the life of the believer subsequent to conversion. (I Thess. 5:23; Acts 1:8; Romans 6:1-14)
- 8. Provision is made in the redemptive work of the Lord Jesus Christ for the healing of the mortal body. Prayer for the sick and anointing with oil are taught in the Scriptures and are privileges for the Church in this present age. (Matthew 8:16,17; James 5:13-16)
- 9. The Church consists of all those who believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, are redeemed through His blood, and are born again of the Holy Spirit. Christ is the Head of the Body, the Church, which has been commissioned by Him into all the world as a witness, preaching the gospel to all nations. The local church is a body of believers in Christ who are joined together for the worship of God, for edification through the Word of God, for prayer, fellowship, the proclamation of the gospel, and observance of the ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. (Ephesians 1:22,23; Matthew 28:19,20; Acts 2:41-47)
- 10. There shall be a bodily resurrection of the just and of the unjust; for the former, a resurrection unto life; for the latter, a resurrection unto judgment. (I Corinthians 15:20-23; John 5:28,29)

11. The Second Coming of the Lord Jesus Christ is imminent and will be personal, visible and premillenial. This is believer's blessed hope and is a vital truth which is an incentive to holy living and faithful service. (Hebrews 10:37; Luke 21:27; Titus 2:11-14)

The Great Commission

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." —Jesus Christ's Great Commission is the Call of The Christian and Missionary Alliance—it's why we exist! And that is what has made The Alliance one of the most effective missions organizations the world has known. When it comes to sharing the reason for our hope, faith, and joy, we reach more people when we work together. Our partnership in building Christ's Church worldwide is getting the job done!

We hope you, too, will join the thousands of people who regularly participate in the worldwide work of Alliance Great Commission Ministries.

So what is it going to take?

We need to work together. Completing the Great Commission will require the mobilization of every fully devoted disciple of Jesus Christ. Through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, the Alliance family is committed to developing healthy people (fully devoted followers of Christ), who come together to build healthy churches (unified as the Body of Christ through the indwelling Holy Spirit) that produce a bountiful harvest (completing Christ's Great Commission).

Funding this work is no small task. It takes approximately \$40,000 annually to keep an individual worker on the field. Where we go

We go wherever darkness has a foothold. Today, there are more than 2,000 Alliance churches in the United States, and approximately 30,000 fellowships in 70+ countries around the world with nearly 6 million Christians calling themselves "Alliance."

In 2011 alone, our Envision Trips sent up to 1,800 people on short-term outreaches; 85 individuals went on a four-week or more assignment somewhere in this world—all to be points of light.

PAC began as a Bible study spawned from Southside Alliance Church in Sheboygan. The group grew quickly, and, renting the Sheboygan County Fairgrounds cafeteria, we began holding our first worship services in 1982 under the leadership of church-planting pastor Daryl Jacobsen.

In 1983 we formally organized as a church of the Christian and Missionary Alliance. In 1985, having outgrown our space in the cafeteria, we purchased our current property and built our current building, holding our first service in the new building in 1986.

PAC continued to grow and a building expansion took place about 1990. We continue to pursue God's direction for His church. Our mission is to glorify God by making disciples of Jesus Christ, carrying out the Great Commission and the Great Commandment to the best of our ability.
